Florida Governor Ron DeSantis has <u>signed into law</u> a bill that opponents have dubbed "Don't Say Gay."

DeSantis "blasted critics for what he said was willfully misinterpreting its provisions, though some of the language in the law is vague and subject to interpretation.

'They're doing it because they actually support having woke gender ideology in the first grade,' the governor said." (NY Times, 3/28)
