SCOTUS Draft Opinion on Abortion

A *Politico* article on May 2 revealed a draft majority opinion written by Supreme Court Justice Samuel Alito which overturns federal protection of abortion rights. The right to abortion has been protected since the 1973 *Roe v. Wade* decision.

The leak of the draft opinion is extraordinary. The *Politico* article notes, "No draft decision in the modern history of the court has been disclosed publicly while a case was still pending."

The leaked opinion is only a draft, and the justices can change their positions before the Supreme Court issues its decision. For now, abortion rights remain federally protected.
